



Yavapai County Republican Committee
Approved Resolution, March 30, 2024

Elections should be held on one day, with the verification of qualified electors, on secret paper ballots, hand counted at the precinct level without the use of machines.

Whereas, a machine cannot swear an oath to the Constitution and machines can be programmed to count votes incorrectly or hacked by people with nefarious motives, and

Whereas, electors must be verified with identification to show that they are qualified electors for the ballot to be cast, and

Whereas, ballots which are not on paper present issues with verification if election fraud has occurred, and

Whereas, elections which occur on more than one day allow for election fraud to occur, and

Whereas, mail-in/absentee ballots should be limited to use by military and disabled voters, and

Whereas, The Arizona Senate audit of the 2020 Election found significant inconsistencies and discrepancies, and

Whereas, there have been multiple convictions in Arizona for election fraud that occurred during the 2020 election, and

Whereas, hand counting ballots at the precinct level has worked for many years and makes it difficult for fraud to occur.

Now therefore, the Yavapai County Republican Committee resolves that our legislators should work to pass laws and enforce existing laws that ensure that elections shall be held on one day, with the verification of qualified electors, on secret paper ballots, hand counted at the precinct level without the use of machines.
